It will deal specifically with our neighborhood and will be concerned with open space and parks, population density, traffic patterns, public transit, noise, social services for the elderly and disabled, safety, and other factors which directly affect the quality of life in our neighborhood.

Unless we, as Thousand Oaks residents, participate in preparing the new Master Plan, city administrators and planners will do it for us. A number of your concerned neighbors have been meeting in recent weeks to form a new Thousand Oaks Neighborhood Association (TONA). In addition to Master Plan revision, the Association will provide a forum for working out solutions to such common problems as:

- not enough useable park space
- rush hour traffic on narrow streets
- illegal apartments/communes
- poor bus service
- too many cars parked on the streets
- ugly utility lines

As yet, there are no officers, bylaws or dues. We want the entire community to participate when these are decided.
